# **Split**



**Split**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and the biggest town on the Croatian coast. It is a sparkling, lively city with a vibrant, cosmopolitan atmosphere where ancient and modern life sits comfortably side by side.

Centred around the impressive 1,800 year-old Diocletian's Palace, a summer residence built for the emperor Diocletian in the third and fourth centuries, Split is a compelling region which successfully blends a proudly preserved rich history with modern day life

The University of Split was officially established on 15 June 1974. It includes nine Faculties, one Academy of Arts, two University colleges and two University Departments as well as several institutes and scientific units. Over 20.000 students study at the University. (http://www.unist.hr)

#### HOW TO REACH SPLIT

Whether by plane, boat, bus, train or car, it's getting ever easier to **travel to Split.** With new trains, new air routes, a new motorway to Zagreb plus dozens of ferries and buses, Split is becoming one of Croatia's prime points of entry.

There are not a lot of direct flights to Split (most go to Zagreb) that run all year but from April to October there are quite a few low-cost carriers that fly directly to Split from a number of cities. For more information visit the Split airport website:

## To & from Split airport

Split Airport is located at the very exit from the town of Kastela, towards Trogir. It is at 20 km distance from Split, and at 6 km from Trogir.



## **SUMMER SEMINAR VENUE**



Rooms "dr. Franjo Tuđman" are located in Split, just 2 km from the UNESCO-protected Diocletian's Palace and a 10-minute walk from Žnjan beach. The complex features free WiFi, free parking on site, as well as a gym and a shared lounge with TV.

#### **CROATIAN MONEY**

The Croatian currency is the Kuna, which is divided into 100 lipas. The Kuna comes in dominations of 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, 500...

The Lipa comes in coins of 1, 2, 5, 10, 20 and 50.

In larger shops (supermarkets, drugstores/pharmacies, souvenir shops) cards are readily accepted. Paying by card in a hotel is also very straightforward. More established restaurants in larger towns should also accept cards. The smaller the town/restaurant (particularly on the islands), the less likely that cards are accepted. It's therefore always a good idea to have some cash to hand.
