English Summary:

The Faculty of Philosophy in Niš: partner in a scientific project of the German DAAD

The first activities within the research project "Digesting Crises in Europe (DICE): Constructing and Deconstructing Media Texts in Dialogue" were realized at the Faculty of Philosophy in Niš from 15 to 18 May 2017.

The project is being implemented by the support of the German Academic Exchange Service (Deutscher Akademischer Austauschdienst - DAAD) "Dialogue between East and West: Dialogue in Higher Education in the Western Balkans 2017 - 2018" and represents a multilateral scientific cooperation between higher education institutions from Germany, Albania, Macedonia and Serbia. The project coordinator is prof. Dr Schmied, head of the Department of English language and literature at the Technical University in Chemnitz, Germany.

During the four-day visit at the Faculty of Philosophy in Niš, the partner institution representatives realized a series workshops in which they presented methods and techniques of media discourse analysis and corpus linguistics. Another activity planned within the project is a summer school in Ohrid from 10 to 17 August 2017. The participation of both lecturers and students from the Faculty of Philosophy in Niš is planned.

Asst. prof. Jasmina Djordjevic from the Foreign language centre points out that this research project is important because it enables academic cooperation between higher education institutions in the southeastern Balkans under a theme that connects many different scientific disciplines. Since the topic is media discourse analysis, the project involves teachers, staff and students at the post-graduate and doctoral level at the Faculty of Philosophy in Niš from the departments of Communication and journalism, Serbian language and literature, English language and literature and the Foreign language centre.
